The Michigan Chapter was established on March 30, 1971, to provide local activates for the NEMGTR members in the Great Lakes area. In addition to driving events, membership meetings are held regularly. Board meetings are scheduled intermittently (generally monthly) throughout the year. An annual business meeting, which includes the election of officers, is held in the last quarter of each year.

Membership dues are \$15.00 per year, payable by April 1st. Michigan Chapter members are required to be members of the New England MGT Register, Ltd.

Date: Saturday, March 16th, 2013


Place: Jacobsen Industries (with our host, Lee Jacobsen) 12173 Market Street Livonia, MI 48150

THE NEW MEMBERSHIP DUES...

The T-Club for the past several years has been financially sound. But we must do the math for the future in a simply form to be able to understand what is happening currently. So here we go:

With approximately 71 members (3 of which are lifetime members and pay no dues) paying \$15.00 per year, the club takes in approximately **\$1,020.00**.

If we refer to the financial statement last year, the club expenses were **\$2,240.00**. This means we spent **\$1,220.00** more than we took in.

To date, this has not been too much of a problem since the club checking has a decent balance. The \$2,240.00 listed above <u>does not include printing of the club newsletter</u>, the T-Times. Printing has been gifted to the club for the last couple of years, but we should not continue operating under this assumption any longer.

In obtaining current costs if we paid to have it printed professionally, would be as follows:

A 16 page newsletter, color cover, black & white interior, 100 copies would cost: \$234.00 A 12 page newsletter, color cover, black & white interior, 100 copies would cost: \$184.00

A 16 page newsletter, all color, 100 copies would cost \$512.00

A 12 page newsletter, all color, 100 copies would cost \$384.00

Currently we send out newsletters six times a year.

At the very least, we would be paying an additional \$1,104.00 per year in professional printing.

We could of course, have fewer newsletter, but you get the idea, we would still be spending more than we take in.

To avoid financial issues in the future if and when we no longer have free printing, we need to make some changes now.

First, the club dues of \$15.00 have never been increased in 40 years. The Executive Board has voted to change that amount now. It was announced at the Hibernation Party/Annual Meeting that dues would increase to **\$25.00 per membership** if you wanted the newsletter emailed or **\$35.00 per membership** if you wanted a copy of the newsletter mailed to your home address.

With this edition of the newsletter, you will also receive one emailed copy so you can compare and decide which way you would like to renew your membership.

After renewals this year, we will be able to better judge if this will be enough to correct to financial flow, which we think it will. Other fixes as mentioned above, we can have fewer newsletters each year, but hopefully that will not be the case. And with emailed newsletter, it is a greener way to go so that may work out as well.

The club is growing, and more activities are being planned each year. Costs continue to go up in life so we are hoping with the increase in dues, we can continue in the same direction that the club is presently going and this can resolve some of the costs sustained each year.

Dues and application for renewal (on the other side of the page) are due by April 1st, 2013.


And to upstage the Queen, two - yes two, T Cars drove to the party. That may be another first for the event. Both TD's belonging to Linda / Jim



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
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


CANDLE WITH TISSUE PAPER TRANSFER INSTRUCTIONS

Instructions on how to recreate the candles in the centerpiece at the Hibernation Party were requested by several members at the event be included in the T-Times.

- Create the design on your computer that you wish to transfer onto the candle.
- Cut a piece of tissue paper to completely wrap around a 8 1/2 X 11 sheet of copy paper and tape the edges down smoothly to the underside of the copy paper.
- Print the image on the tissue/copy paper.
- Remove the tissue paper with the image on it from the copy paper.
- Cut out the image and place it on the candle. Cut away any excess tissue paper.
- Take a piece of wax paper (larger than the candle) and pull it tightly around to the back of the candle.
- Use a heat gun to melt your design onto the candle, moving it in a back and forth motion for about 30-40 seconds across the wax paper/design underneath..
- Once the entire design is heated, gently peel back the wax paper and make sure the entire image is adhered to the candle. If not, repeat with wax paper and heat gun.
- Other methods, like stamping on the tissue paper instead of computer printing are also found online, just search "tissue paper candles".
