We all want to get our 'T' cars on the road as soon as the roads are dry and salt-free. Having warm temperatures is desirable, but not necessary! What <u>is</u> necessary is that the cars are safe to drive, not only for yourself, but your passengers and other motorists. The *Vehicle Inspection Check List* is a revised version of one created by Andy Hanzel and used during a previous Tech Session. We'll be using again on March 27 this year. The intent of the check list is to give an average owner with a minimum of tools a starting point to bring his or her 'T' out of hibernation, and isn't hugely time consuming in the process. If the inspection reveals some deficiencies that need attention...that's another story, and it usually involves Murphy and his Laws. If you have any questions about what you are looking for, or what may be OK for now, but will need attention in the future, send me an email.

## '50s Era Put-in-Bay Sports Car Races Set for Second Annual Reunion, June 29-30, 2010 on Historic Ohio Island



Planning is well underway for the second annual Put-in-Bay Sportscar Races Reunion, an event commemorating the races held on the public roads of Put-in-Bay from 1952 to 1959 (and one event in 1963). Details are currently tentative, but are being actively firmed up by a team of committed volunteers.

WHEN: The 2010 Put-in-Bay Sports Car Races Reunion will be held Monday-Wednesday, June 28-30 on South Bass Island (Put-in-Bay), Ohio.

WHO IS INVOLVED? Coordinated by staff and volunteers associated with several established vintage racing associations, the Lake Erie Islands Historical Society (www.leihs.com) and the village of Put-in-Bay, OH.

WHO IS INVITED? A special effort is being made to gather the actual race cars and the people who participated in the Put-in-Bay races, but <u>all</u> with an interest in preserving the history of '50s sports car racing are invited to attend this casual, low-key gathering.

WHERE? Put-in-Bay (South Bass Island) is off the Lake Erie shore, a 30-minute ferry ride north of Catawba Island, and less than an hour east of Toledo.

WHY? To re-live and capture the memories. Proceeds of this event (and those planned for the future) are to support the Put-in-Bay Sportscar Races archives and exhibit at the Lake Erie Historical Society Museum at Put-in-Bay.
