Be considerate of others.

If your showing your car, don't crank your stereo. Some people enjoy the music already playing by the DJ or Announcer. They also want to listen to any information, door prize give away, contests, problems etc. that might come across the loud system. If your blaring your bazillion watt stereo, no one can hear it.

Pick up your trash.

Don't just leave your nasty rags, empty cleaner or detail spray bottles, soda cans, water bottle etc. Someone must clean up after the event, most times it is the person that had to get there two hours before the show to set things up. They are hot, tired and ready to go home too.



Date: Tuesday June 23 - Friday June 26

Host Hotel location: Birchwood Inn, Harbor Springs Michigan

Alternate hotel location: Colonial Inn (3 miles) Best Western (6 miles)

Michigan is in the early stages of planning to host the GOF Central 2020 in Harbor Springs, Michigan. Hosted at the Birchwood Inn, this is a full service "resort" setting type GOF where we have full access to the entire facility and planning staff for the duration of our event. This is the most beautiful area of Michigan's lower peninsula with amazing driving opportunities.

Lodging: a variety of rooms are available and additional days at discounted rates are available to those wishing to arrive early or stay later. Mid-week schedule allows weekend "travel days" on either side of the event. While the Inn is a smaller venue, there is additional lodging nearby.

Planning and costs: Staff at the Inn can handle the bulk of the arrangements and needs, resulting in minimal volunteer effort. 3 nights double occupancy room, Continental breakfast, the first timer's car show BBQ, 24 hour hospitality room (BYOB), lecture room, car wash and closing awards banquet included in one total estimated cost: \$500 per person, based on double occupancy. Alternate nearby hotels are available as well as camping at Petoskey State Park and KOA. We are in the early planning stages and exact costs/arrangements are not fully determined yet.

Want to help plan the event? We will be forming a planning committee for GOF2020 in February 2019. We expect to also work with members of the Twin Bay British Car Club.


